Well, Mary, I could not agree more! And it was in this spirit that the Gourley Township Food Exchange was created. The Gourley Township Food Exchange was created in April of 2024 and is a member-only Facebook group whose purpose is to bring local people together to show others what they are growing and producing, and to encourage like-minded people to swap food items for other food items, services, supplies, etc.

It is true that "the early bird gets the worm" and last December, the Gourley Township Food Exchange organized a seed purchase. Seeds are expensive enough, but the shipping charges are outrageous! A community seed purchase is one way to reduce the cost of garden seeds by taking advantage of discounts for large orders and seed company coupons. And it did just that.


Thanks to a few local residents who participated in the seed purchase, we were able to order over \$200 of seeds from Johnny's which then qualified for free shipping! If each of us had placed our own order, we would have incurred shipping charges anywhere from 10% to over 20% of our individual orders.

Burpee doesn't offer free shipping for large orders, but because I am a regular customer, I frequently get 20% off coupons which I applied to the Burpee order, and this essentially paid for the shipping of our Burpee seeds.

MIgardener is my new favorite seed supplier. The owner, Luke, offers a large selection of seeds for the reasonable price of \$2 per pack. He also has a fantastic YouTube channel with many how-to videos that help home gardeners get the most from their gardens. (https://www.youtube.com/@MIgardener).

George Washington's Birthday 2025

February 17th

George Washington's Birthday is celebrated on the third Monday in February. Americans celebrated Washington's Birthday long before Congress declared it a federal holiday. In 1862, the House and Senate commemorated the 130th Anniversary of Washington's birth by reading aloud his Farewell Address. It was considered a morale-boosting gesture during the darkest days of the Civil War, and this tradition has continued to this day. In his Farewell Address, Washington warned that the forces of geographical sectionalism, political factionalism, and interference by foreign powers in the nation's domestic affairs threatened the stability of the republic. He urged Americans to subordinate sectional jealousies to common national interests. Contrary to popular belief, neither Congress nor the President has ever stipulated that the name of the holiday observed as Washington's Birthday be changed to "President's Day."
